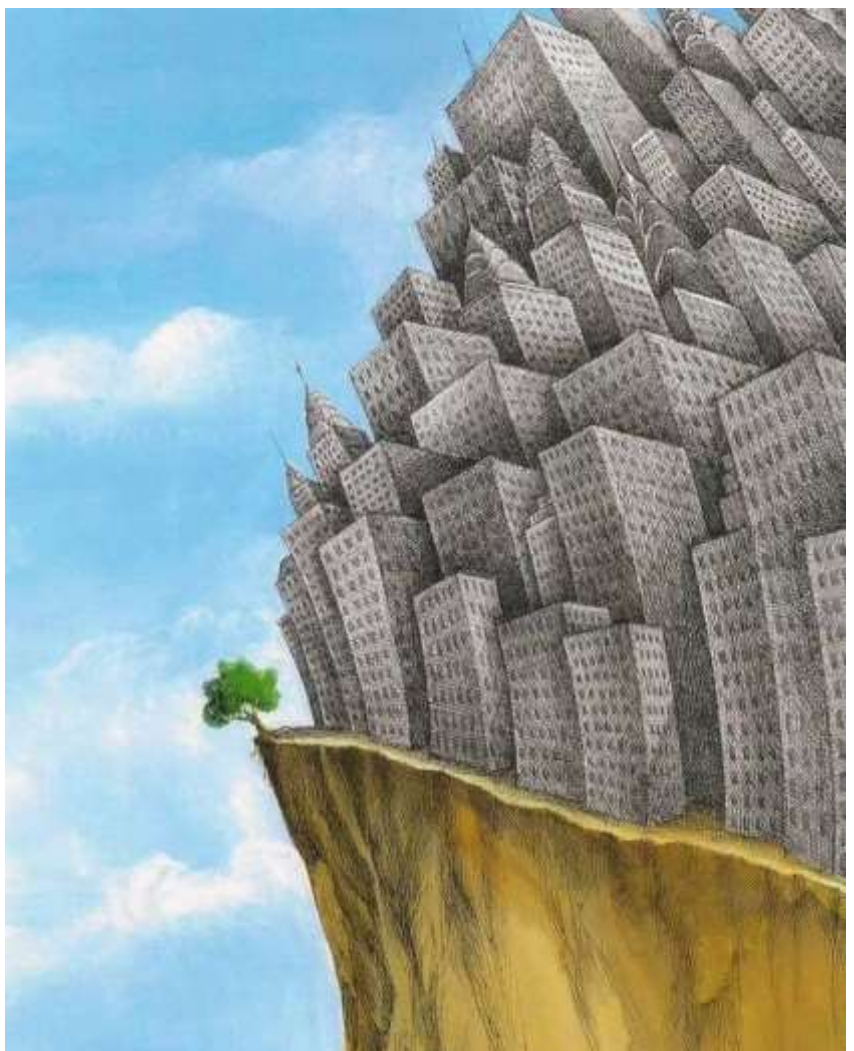
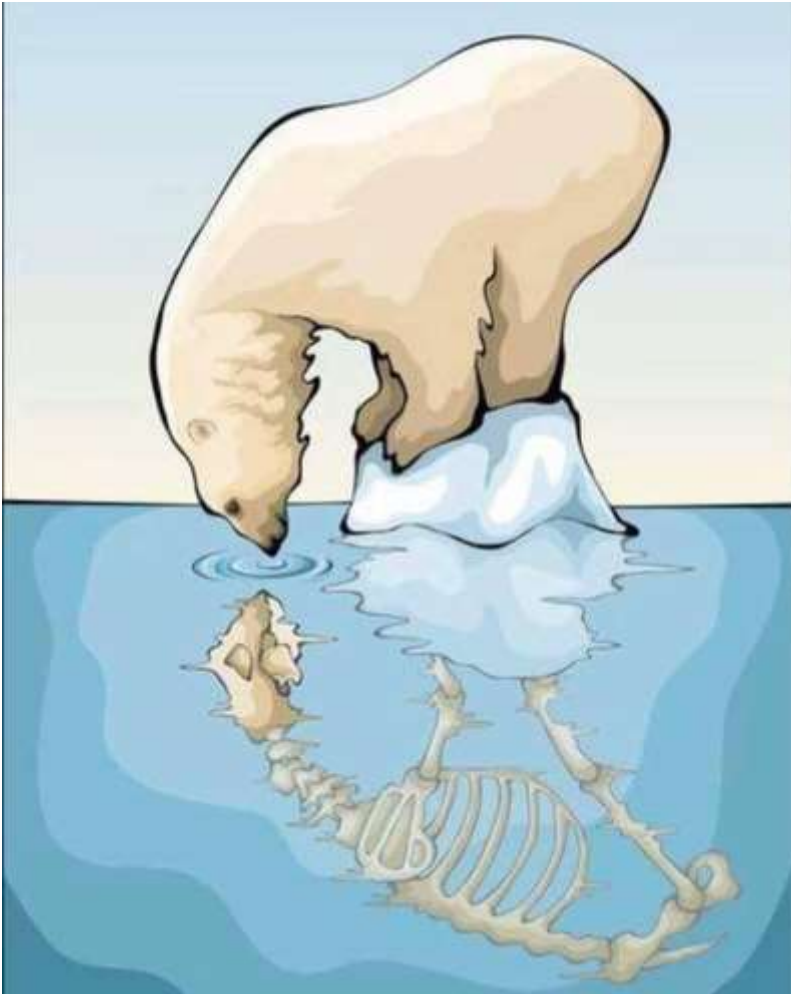
Responsibility

Sian: Do you have any good ideas for stimuli for the concept of responsibility? Images or books?

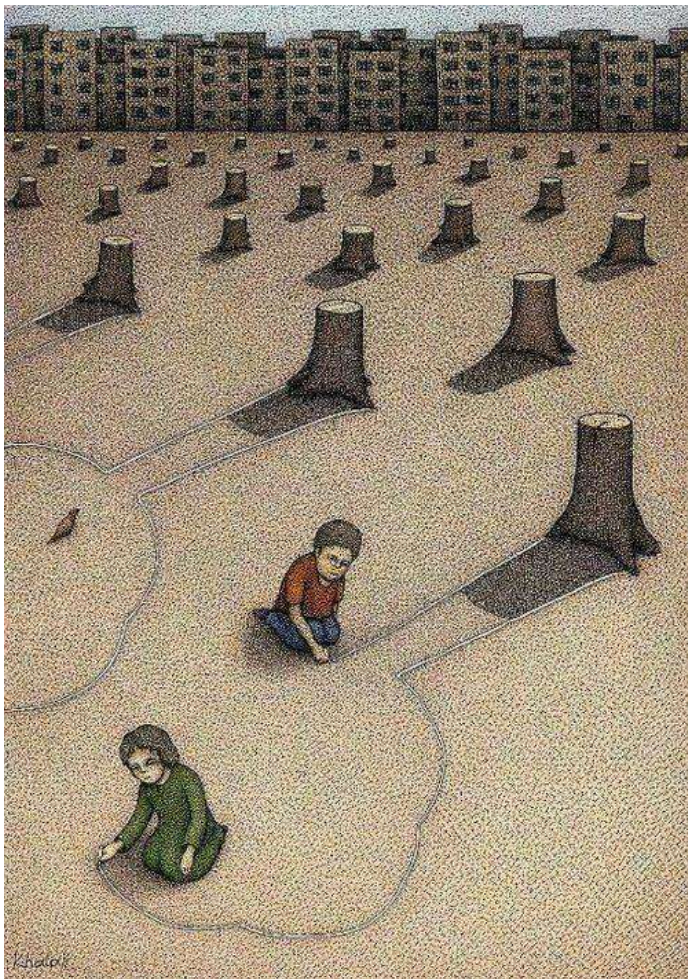
Nick: One here: look also for the who's in charge photo" of my (once) little girl and my very big llama on SAPERE resources

Nick: It might also be useful to know that the word responsibility is derived from 'response' - suggesting that something needs a response, so if you have a responsibility for something, you need to actually do something about it. Interesting to explore the difference between responsible (obligation/duty) and responsible (accountable for).
